

KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

Happy New Year and welcome back to the start of the Spring Term. I hope you have a had a lovely Christmas break and that your child has enjoyed being back in school this week. It has been a happy week with lots of positive things happening including our youngest children dressing up as Super Heroes to launch their new topic, 'Super Heroes and People Who Help Us'!

To help you understand a little more about the subjects your child will be covering over the next few weeks, we hope you find the class newsletters, which you have been sent today as attachments, useful. If they throw up any questions, you will have an opportunity to ask them at next week's parent workshops.

Online Parent Workshops – to supporting your child through the curriculum:

Next week we will be running short workshops with a focus on the curriculum and what you can do to support your child on the learning journey. These will be virtual meetings which you can access via Google Classroom using your child's account as you did for Meet the Teacher meetings at the beginning of the year.

At the start of next week, a link to the Google Meet session will be posted in the 'Stream' section of Google Classroom by your child's class teacher which you simply click on to get into the meeting. Please note **that in order to gain access to the site you must log in using your child's school email address not yours**. This allows us to see who is trying to gain access so our safeguarding arrangements are not compromised. If you can aim to log in just before the meeting start time that would be incredibly helpful; once staff start sharing PowerPoint presentations, we cannot always see who is waiting to be let in. ScoPay:

Thank you for ensuring lunch orders are placed for your child well in advance to ensure the catering team have accurate numbers when placing food orders. The menu this term remains the same as last term and can be found on our website. The office politely request that any Scopay dinner money accounts are cleared and that accounts related to Early Bird sessions are also topped up on a regular basis. Thank you.

No Nuts/No Sesame:

Please can I remind you that we are a no nut and no sesame school. On no account send your child in to school with anything containing these items either in packed lunch boxes, as snacks or as birthday treats to give out to the other children (please note chocolate selection boxes often contain nuts). We have children with severe allergies for whom exposed to these foods could be life threatening. Thank you

Sickness and Diarrhoea:

The children all seem to have returned to school in good health which is fabulous. However, from time to time we are hit with sickness bugs so it is our policy that a child must not return to school for at least 24 hours, preferably 48 hours, after any bout of vomiting or diarrhoea. Thank you for your support in this matter which will help us safeguard everyone.

Attendance:

As directed by the Department for Education, schools are now required to monitor attendance very closely. As the school's attendance officer, on a termly basis, I meet with the borough's Education Welfare Officer. She receives our attendance data on a monthly basis and uses these meetings to scrutinise our figures. It is the expectations that a child's attendance should be at least 96%. Attendance below 95% is deemed persistent absence and anything below 50%, severe.

While we understand that sometimes there are genuine reasons, notably illness, which means it is not appropriate to send your child to school, any time away from the classroom is incredibly disruptive. A lesson missed puts a pupil at a disadvantage especially when that lesson falls within a sequence of planned learning activities. We appreciate that it can be difficult to arrange medical appointments outside school hours and some circumstances, in the case of music examinations for instance, demand time out of school. However, any situation (other than illness or a medical appointment) requires you to complete a 'Request for Term Time Absence Form' outlining the reasons why your child might be away. This can be found on our website. Occasionally, when a child is ill it might be the case that we request a doctors' certificate especially if absent for an extended period.

Term time holidays are not permitted and will be marked as an unauthorised absence. Unauthorised absences or a poor attendance score can generate a home visit from the Education Welfare Officer and/or a penalty notice in extreme circumstances. Term dates can be found on our website and are listed below for your convenience so holidays can be planned outside these dates.

We acknowledge that each family's circumstances are different and it is our aim to work with you all to provide the best education for every child which involves helping those who are absent catch up. I am pleased to report that our overall attendance data is excellent. This year the figure sits at 96.7% and last term 50 children had 100% attendance. If you have need to come through either of the gates to get to the office for instance, please can you ensure that they are shut behind you?
