

KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

HT Fest:

If you were able to come along to Saturday's HT Fest, I hope you enjoyed the event. It was lovely to see so many of you here despite a rather soggy start and the England win was a spectacular way to end the day. My thanks go to all of you who helped in one way or another. Whether it was setting up or packing down, running a stall or providing entertainment, keeping everyone fed or watered, thank you; what a terrific team effort. It was also wonderful to see so many children take to the stage. Providing a platform for them to perform in front of such a large audience brings so many benefits. My thanks, in particular, go to Sam and Kate along with the PTA Committee who worked tirelessly planning the festival and ensuring all went to plan on the day. It was a great success; we raised in total £2850.16 all of which will support the work we do in ensuring the very best learning experience for your children. Thank you everyone!

Spanish, Rock Steady and Steel Pan Performances:

If you were able to come along to any of the extra activities we have organised this week, the Spanish assembly, the Rock Steady concert and the steel pan lesson, I hope you enjoyed being in school. All three events celebrated just how much progress the children have made in specific areas of the curriculum. I was enormously impressed.

Berkshire School Games:

On Tuesday a number of children from Year 3 and Year 6 went along to the Berkshire School Games at Braywick Leisure Centre. This small scale Olympic style event gave hundreds of children across the county a chance to meet and compete against each other in a number of sporting activities. Year 3 took part in a cricket competition and Year 6 in a touch rugby event. Both involved completing skill based activities before a series of competitive games.

In the afternoon the children took part in 'Active 60' where they tried out different sports including fencing, cycling, break dancing and wrestling. The teams were awarded medals related to sports values. Our children came away with medals for team work and determination; we were proud of them all.

Building Bird Boxes with Bisham Nest Box Group:

Having successfully raised £98 at HT Fest selling popcorn and cakes and encouraging others to take part in games they had invented, the Eco-Council worked with Brenden from Bisham Nest Box Group on Wednesday afternoon to construct bird boxes from the kits they had bought with the money. These are going to be put up around the school in the hope that birds come to roost.

Year 2 Trip to Tumblestone Hollow:

Yesterday, Year 2 had a fabulous time at Tumblestone Hollow, an adventure play area just outside Henley Upon Thames. The design of the park is based around a book written by author Amy Sparkes called 'The Legend of Tumblestone Hollow'. Throughout the day the children encountered characters and explored the magic as they played, learnt and enjoyed the outdoors in a visually inspiring environment. Parents & Carers Cyber Choices Webinars:

This week we have received an email from the royal borough asking us to circulate a message from Thames Valley Police about webinars for parents and carers on cyber choices, focusing specifically on educating young people about computer misuse offences and safeguarding them from committing them. These sessions last around an hour and are totally FREE to attend. They are aimed at parents/carers of a wide range of children/young people, from KS2 pupils (7-8 year olds) right up to college/university students (18+) Each webinar covers the same material, so if you are interested you only need sign up for one of them. Although it might seem a long time away, we would be most grateful if you could also ensure that you have ordered school meals for your child for when they return in September.
