

# **KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK**

### No Nuts & No Sesame:

I do hope you saw my email earlier in the week stressing again the importance of not sending your child to school with anything containing nuts or sesame. Please be vigilant, ensuring everyone in your household knows the significance of this. After a very serious incident on Tuesday, our preference would be to request that the children only bring in fresh fruit as a snack. However, if this is not feasible please check packaging and listed ingredients on all products including dried fruit snacks and cereal bars, many of which do contain nuts.

As Tuesday's incident confirmed, we have children in school with severe allergies who are dangerously affected when coming into contact with such items. We must all work together to safeguard them.

# Supporting Partners for Change, Ethiopia:

Our Lent fundraising project for Partners for Change, Ethiopia, a charity we have supported for over eleven years, got off to a great start on Tuesday with a Bags to School event. Collectively we managed to collect 373kg of clothes which means we have already raised £74.60 for the charity. Our thanks go to Mrs. Ransome who coordinated the collection for us.

Year 6 have started their fundraising event, a walkathon which will see them clock up 430 miles, the distance from Cookham to just over the Scottish boarder. They are all aiming to walk one mile of the fitness track each day for the next three weeks in return for sponsorship. So far they have almost made it to Manchester!

Year 3 have been busy during the week bringing in, as well as making, pocket toys to sell to their friends. Lunchtime sales this week have added to our fundraising total. Our aim is to send as many children as possible to Tibase M School with breakfast in their tummies but to do so, we need to work hard. A breakfast for each child per day costs £1 so with 60 children desperately needing our help, we hope to reach as many as possible.

To add to our current total, in just over a week, on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> March, Year 4 have decided that they would like to hold a teddy bears' picnic which they are inviting anyone to attend if they wish. Our catering team will be providing packed lunches in place of cooked meals so all your child needs to bring is a teddy bear and maybe a picnic rug. To join the party, Year 4 ask for a donation of 50p. If you wish to order a grab bag, orders must be placed on Scopay by midnight on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> March.

Next week Year 2 are holding a soft toy sale. They are looking for donations so any sent in will be gratefully received. Their toy shop will be open on Thursday (20<sup>th</sup> March) at lunchtime with any left-over items sold the next day. The following week, on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> March, Year 1 and Reception Class will be holding a board game and jigsaw puzzle sale. If you have any complete puzzles or games you are also willing to donate which our youngest children can sell, please send them in too. In the same week, as well as the Year 4 picnic, Year 5 will be organising a 'book toppling' extravaganza – think of dominoes falling and you'll get the idea – after which they will be giving the books away as prizes in their tombola.

It has been wonderful to see how much excitement the project has generated already and how willing the children are to donate their pocket money to the campaign.
