We hope your child has enjoyed the week and has spoken positively about all the things that have been happening. Year 4 enjoyed a walk around Cookham on Wednesday morning searching for human and physical geographical features while Year 6 excelled in their steel pan lesson in the afternoon. For Year 3 it's been a journey inside the human body looking at the skeleton so the learning for everyone has been vast and varied.

On Thursday we enjoyed a visit from Father Stephen and his Open the Book team when they led collective worship. Their actions and sound effects really helped to bring the story to life!

### Use of the Trim Trail:

The use of the trim trail, the climbing equipment at the bottom of our playground, has been restricted recently because of the icy conditions. Every day we make an assessment in line with our health and safety policy and, when the children are able to use it, supervision is tight. In the interests of safeguarding and because staff are not available to provide supervision at the end of the day, we kindly request that your children do not use the trim trail after they have been handed over to you at 3:15pm. Thank you.

The office staff are incredibly grateful when you are able to send your child to school with all the equipment they need for the day. We do appreciate that sometimes the children forget items but the need to deliver packed lunch boxes, homework books, football boots etc. that have been dropped off after the gate is locked, takes the team away from important jobs which prevents the office from functioning as efficiently as it should. Can I offer a gentle reminder not to use the staff car park in the morning when dropping off a child, or in the afternoon (until after 5pm if picking up your child from Wrap AroundCare). Because of the tight space, with staff coming in and out and because of the restricted visibility when turning into School Lane, hazards are increased.
