

KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

Teddy Bears' Picnic - Monday (24th March) No Nuts & No Sesame:

I trust you saw my email at the beginning of the week about the need to order a grab-bag or send your child in with a packed lunch on Monday if they would like to support Year 4 in their Partners for Change, Ethiopia event. If you have not placed an order for a grab-bag, regardless of which year group your child is in, you must send your child in on Monday with a packed lunch. There will be no other food options available. The children who choose to go to the teddy bears' picnic will join Year 4 outside, those choosing not to will eat their packed lunches or grab bags in the hall.

If you are sending your child in with their own packed lunch please remember not to include anything containing nuts or sesame. We have children in school with severe allergies who are dangerously affected when coming into contact with such items. Please continue to be mindful of the ingredients in food items which might not obviously have nuts or sesame. I was alerted to the fact only this week that certain rice cakes contain sesame. Thank you for working with us to safeguard everyone.

This morning Year 6 enjoyed a workshop with 'Learning to Work', the team who brought us the Ascot Bake-Off competition. The focus was on sustainability and innovation while at the same time learning what it is like to work at an airport. They were supported in small teams to use 3D design software while developing skills of teamwork, communication, problem solving, creative thinking and adaptability.
