It is a test of their skill, their motivation and their desire to achieve. We are proud of all those who exhibited and spoke so passionately about the work they had undertaken and the journey it had taken them on.

Our Journey Towards Achieving a Silver Attachment Aware School's Award:

Last year we were successful in achieving a bronze Attachment Aware School's Award, an accreditation which aims to ensure that everyone within an educational environment has a good knowledge of the needs of children and young people who have experienced adversity and of the strategies and resources that are available to meet such needs. Achieving the award recognises the commitment schools have in developing a culture of compassion and nurture, which plays a pivotal role in getting children and young people into a state of 'learning readiness'. The award is issued only to those educational establishments that can demonstrate that they have met its rigorous quality standards and can maintain them over time, so we were delighted to be awarded bronze last year.

Proud of such recognition and achievement, this year we decided to go for silver. On Tuesday we received a visit from Joanna Western, Attachment and Trauma Informed Practice Lead. She spent time speaking to a number of children some of whom showed her around school. She asked about projects we have been working on and she was particularly interested to hear how we promote pupil voice. We now wait to see if we have been successful in achieving the silver award.
