

KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

It seems to be the growing tradition at Holy Trinity, we end the term having had an exceptionally busy week! I am sure your child is tired after all the things that have been going on and is looking forward to the week ahead when they can take a moment to rest and recharge the batteries!

Walk to School Week:

Walk to School Week has been highly successful because of the way the children, with your support, have embraced the messages behind this year's campaign Walk to School Week (livingstreets.org.uk). Throughout the week the children have been filling in class charts and individual passports. We hope they have enjoyed finding creative ways to come to school and learning about the magic of nature, movement, happiness, friendship and community.

Tri-Golf at Winter Hill:

Part of the Ascot and Maidenhead's School Sports Partnership is encouraging every young person to engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day. Walk to School Week really helped with this but several other sporting events have taken place, organised by the partnership, that we have taken part in. Attendance:

As we approach the end of another term, I write to remind you that attendance at school is compulsory unless a child is poorly. Requests for holidays, even if it's just one day, should not be made; I am not permitted to grant them. Absence because a holiday has been taken goes down on a child's record as an unauthorised absence. These unauthorised absences are scrutinised by the school's Education Welfare Officer who meets with me on a regular basis and who requests meetings with parents when attendance becomes a concern.

As I'm sure you can appreciate, any time away from the classroom is incredibly disruptive. A lesson missed puts a pupil at a disadvantage especially when that lesson falls within a sequence of planned learning activities. You may be interested to read findings from some DfE research, published in 2022, which highlights the link between absence and attainment at KS2 and KS4.
