Year 5 and Year 6 enjoyed an extension to Science and Technology Week when Mr Cuin-Wood came in on Wednesday to speak to them on an interesting topic; 'Are we Alone in the Universe?' It certainly gave them food for thought!

Year 3 Trip to the Chiltern Open Air Museum:

On the same day Mr Cuin-Wood was in talking to upper Key Stage 2, Year 3 were out visiting the Chiltern Open Air Museum. They had a fantastic day travelling back in time to the Mesolithic period of the Stone Age. Their first workshop focused on life in the Stone Age during which they built tents, made fire, aimed spears at a giant woolly mammoth and used charcoal to face paint. After lunch they made their own mini spears using Stone Age glue! There was just enough time to make friends with a squirrel and have fun in the playground before returning to school.
