In lessons we've shared a lovely picture book, The Bridges' written by Tom Percival, which was the choice for some when they filled in book review cards soon to appear in the book shop. It was a perfect choice; it told the story of Mia who finds herself alone in a dark world. Things change when one day she receives a book. As she reads it, she notices bridges appear and the more she reads the stronger the bridges become, opening up a world of connection and hope. The message is simple but powerful. We hope that the week, which you also made happen through your financial contribution to our five themed weeks that run throughout the year, has excited and inspired the children in lots of different ways.
