

# KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

Welcome back to the start of a new term. We all hope you had a wonderful half term break and that your child has enjoyed being back in the classroom learning with their friends. This week we have been gearing up for Arts and Culture Week and praying for good weather for the afternoon of Friday 14<sup>th</sup> June when you are all invited to come in and see our show. #### PTA School Disco:

I do hope your child is looking forward to this evening's PTA disco if they are coming along. The team will be waiting at the front entrance to sign them in.

Children in EYFS and KS1 should arrive at 4:30pm. If your child is at Sewing Club or iPro football training and you would like us to take them directly to the disco from the club, please inform the office if you haven't already done so, so we can be sure of which children to collect. If your child is going to WrapAroundCare first, please inform Sophia and her team yourself.

Children in EYFS and/or KS1 should be collected from the back door of the hall at 5:50pm. We will be as quick as we can handing them over but it may take a little while. Thank you for your patience while we do this.

Once all the younger children have safely left, we will then open the doors at the front of school to allow KS2 children to come in. They too should be collected from the back door of the hall at 7:30pm.

We would be grateful if you could discourage your child from bringing unnecessary items with them which may get mislaid. Thank you for your help in making this a wonderful evening for the children.

Please can I remind you to spend a moment ordering lunches for your child to help the kitchen staff cater for the right number of pupils. #### Class photos:

On Monday 17<sup>th</sup> June the photographer will be in to take class photos and individual photographs of our Year 6 leavers. If your child has P.E. on this day please send them into school looking smart wearing full school uniform. There is no need for them to bring PE kit to change into.

### Attendance:

As we are at the start of a new term, can I reiterate that attendance at school is compulsory unless a child is poorly. Requests for holidays, even if it's just one day, should not be made; I am not permitted to grant them. Absence because a holiday has been taken goes down on a child's record as an unauthorised absence. These unauthorised absences are scrutinised by the school's Education Welfare Officer who meets with me on a regular basis and who requests meetings with parents when attendance becomes a concern.

Any time away from the classroom is incredibly disruptive. A lesson missed puts a pupil at a disadvantage especially when that lesson falls within a sequence of planned learning activities. Throughout the year, requests for term time absence, specifically for holidays, have been made. This term and further into the future, please can I ask you to do all you can to avoid taking your child out of school for reasons other than illness.
